Franklin County Emergency Management Local Mitigation Strategy Meeting Minutes December 4, 2018

Project #1

Update and enhance all communications equipment throughout the county-

Firenet was unoperational since September 2018. Firenet has recently been repaired and is operational since November 2018. Task Force voted to keep this project on the LMS to improve communications throughout the county.

Project #2

Build a new EOC in a central location in Franklin County on Hwy 65 in Eastpoint.-

Franklin County Emergency Management is looking at funding sources for this project.

Project #3

Install Weather/ Water and Wind Gauges applied to all bridges and in various points around Franklin County-

February 2017 FDOT placed wind gauges on the St George Island, Apalachicola, and the Carrabelle Bridge- Franklin County Emergency Management is working with FDOT to access the information

Project #4

Institute Flag system/Display board for beaches-

This project has been completed and will be moving to completed after LMS meeting December 2018.

Project #5

Evaluate and mitigate the sand dunes at McKissack Beach-in Carrabelle

Project is still requiring mitigation. Many residential homes have been affected by storm surge after Hurricane Michael.

Project #6

Construct a new Access Road at Franklin County School for Emergency Use-

Franklin County School has been approved to utilize Florida Forestry Service road as an emergency access route to the school.

Project #7

Replace the components on the Eastpoint sewer lift station.

Components are built just awaiting to installed. This project will be completed by June 2019.

Project #8

Hwy 98 between Eastpoint and Carrabelle needs resurfacing

Hwy 98 after Hurricane Michael has become a hazard to all travelers due to washout and road being compromised from high surge and winds. FDOT has reported that they will opening bids for resurfacing.

Project #9

Perform mitigation on efforts on residence homes against severe hurricanes, high winds, tropical storms, tornadoes and storm surge on low/moderate income owner occupied homes-

Franklin County is constantly working on these projects has funds become available. Currently Franklin County Emergency Management has wind retrofitted 40 homes in the Franklin County area.

Project #10

Continue to plant vegetation along the county's coastal region to reduce erosion, enhance the formation of sand dunes and to protect roads from washouts.

This is an ongoing project for ANNER year round. Living Shorelines educates and assists residence in the importance of mitigation of shorelines.

Project #11

Carrabelle Fire Hydrant System extended to West Side of County located between the light house and Yents Bayou-

Carrabelle Fire Department needs to extend the Fire Hydrant System to assist homes between Carrabelle Beach and Yents Bayou.

Project #12

Work with the Florida Forest Service on evaluating the defensible space on all the critical facilities throughout the county.

This is an ongoing project where the Florida Forest Service identifies and assist all critical facilities in creating a defensible space for all critical facilities.

Project #13

Work with the Florida Forest Service and develop and participate in the Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP) to reduce wildfire risks within the Wildland-Urban Interface. And inform the public of the Firewise building and landscape design principles and the Ready, Set, Go program.

This is an ongoing educational project- They have hosted several town hall meetings to educate the public.

Project #14

Work with the Florida Forest Service in offering forest protection education in the county's schools.

Florida Forest Service has given several scholarships to Franklin County High Students that are interested in pursuing a career in the Florida Forest Service.

Project #15

Install generators at 2 lift stations in Eastpoint-

Ongoing project-EWSD is looking for funding for 2 generators to run the lift station in the event of a power outage.

Project #16

Install Generator for Weems Hospital/ Weems Clinic East

Install Generator to power the hospital/clinic in the event of a major disaster.

Project #17

Identify the critical facilities in the county and review the hazards that could have a negative impact on them after a severe storm event. Evaluate on incorporating and relevant data into the GIS system.

FCEM has assessed all the Critical facilities and coordinates have been completed. Awaiting the surge maps and 911 data overlays.

Project #18

Improve efforts in debris removal of dead, dying or diseased trees and branches next to road and highways.

This is an ongoing project for Duke Energy and FDOT Contractor to maintain and clean all State Road Ways. County/City road departments maintain all roadways in their respective areas.

Project #19/20

Protect and improve functioning of wetlands and waterways

Protect wetlands by locating and eliminating invasive species and plant. This is ongoing project and the task force has combined project 19 and 20.

Project #21

Protect County Road 370 (Alligator Point Road) from hurricane storm surge.

This project has been modified after repeated damage to the road. Franklin County is considering moving the road and acquiring resident's property has been repeatedly damaged.

Project #22

Reduce or prevent stormwater flooding in Apalachicola in the following areas: 24th and 25th Avenues, 8th through 10th Streets between J and G, and on US Highway 98 and 12th and 16th Streets.

Projects have been completed but they have added other projects related to storm water drainage.

Project #23

Identify all flood prone properties and disaster hazard zones to improve the emergency response time and data collection on damage assessment through the county GIS system.

Franklin County Emergency Management and Franklin County Floodplain manager are working to identify and map all the flood prone properties.

Project #24

Install sirens at various points throughout the county

Franklin County has sirens located in DW Wilson Park and Carrabelle RV Park and Franklin County School. FCEM is working on a maintenance testing all sirens.

Project #25

Develop and deliver Disaster Resistant programs for the business and residential communities on "how to prepare" for future disasters.

This is ongoing project that FCEM prepares and educates residents on being prepared for any incident that may occur.

Project #26

Mitigate storm damage caused by flooding on Alternate US 98 (Gulf Avenue, CR 30A South) and SE 12th Street in Carrabelle.
This project is awaiting funding to mitigate the storm water drainage and install additional culverts and conduct a restoration of the wetland area known as the "frog pond".

Project #27

Retrofit the FSU Marine Lab buildings.

Task Force voted to move this project to the bottom of the list until a representative informs FCEM if they are still requesting this project.

Project #28

Storm Water project for Carrabelle

Project to identify and mitigate storm water drainage concerns.

Project #29/30

Raise the Pine Log Bridge Road area on Highway 67 on both sides in Franklin and Liberty Counties./ Raise areas of CR 67 to prevent road flooding

Task force discussed combining the two projects. The new project will be raise areas of CR 67 to prevent road flooding.

Project #31

Identify public and private school facilities that are in need of a wind retrofit.

FCEM and Franklin County School Administration are evaluating school facilities that are in need of retrofit.

Project #32

Conduct Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training for the Franklin County residents.

FCEM is currently planning CERT team training in the wake of Hurricane Michael.

Project #33

Construct a new Fire Station in Alligator Point.

The Current Fire Station is on the list of properties to be purchased with HLMP Funds. .
If this happens the fire department will use part of the funds they receive from this purchase to build a new more disaster resistant fire station. A new fire station of some sort will have to be built in the same general area for the homeowners to receive the same insurance rating. The idea is to build the new station on property currently owned by Capital City Bank that is not in the 100-year flood zone.

Project #34

Install tornado shelters throughout the county.

Moved to bottom of the list due funding and logistics of the shelter

Project #35

Perform a study on the effects of severe hurricanes, high winds, tropical storms, tornadoes and storm surge on businesses that perform essential services to the community.

Project is completed

Project #36

Build a new Wastewater Treatment Plant in Eastpoint.

EPWSD is exploring options for a new waste water treatment plant.

Project #37**Acquire, relocate or elevate repetitive damaged structures throughout the county.**

Franklin County is exploring repetitive structures and working with programs to complete the project.

Project #38**Utilizing the old Bay Work Camp as a Volunteer Disaster Corp Training facility**

This is a new project- Nonprofit organizations want to utilize the work camp to assist and train disaster responders. This is an asset that can be utilized regionally.

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

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

Project #5

Construct a new Access Road at Franklin County School for EM use-

Easement is complete FFS and Franklin County School can begin construction of the road when funds become available

Project #6

Purchase and install and oxygen filling station that can be utilized after a disaster-

This will be a regional asset and will be mobile for the regional area

Project #7

Carrabelle Hydrant System extended to Yents Bayou side of the county-

No update due to agency did not attend

Project #8**Install Generators for all Critical Facilities, lift stations, government fueling depots located in Franklin County-**

Generator projects for critical facilities were combined.

Project #9**Acquire land and construct new landfill-**

Franklin County Landfill is limited on space and new location is needed.

Project #10**Protect County Road 370 (Alligator Point Rd) from hurricane storm surge-**

This project has been modified after repeated damage to the road. Franklin County is considering moving the road and acquiring resident's property has been repeatedly damaged.

Project #11**Perform mitigation on efforts on residence homes against severe hurricanes, high winds, tropical storms, tornadoes and storm surge on low/moderate income owner occupied homes-**

Franklin County is constantly working on these projects has funds become available. Currently Franklin County Emergency Management has wind retrofitted 40 homes in the Franklin County area.

Project #12**Continue to plant vegetation and perform beach renourishment along the county's coastal region to reduce erosion, enhance the formation of sand dunes and to protect roads from washouts**

This is an ongoing project for ANNER year-round. Living Shorelines educates and assists residence in the importance of mitigation of shorelines.

Project #13**FFS assess wildfire risk areas across the county establishing mitigation projects to reduce the fuel loads and thus effectively reduce wildfire risk in these areas-**

This is an ongoing project funded by the FFS to reduce the risks of wildfires in area.

Project #14**Construct a new Fire Station in Alligator Point.**

The Current Fire Station is on the list of properties to be purchased with HLMP Funds. . If this happens the fire department will use part of the funds they receive from this purchase to build a new more disaster resistant fire station. A new fire station of some sort will have to be built in the same general area for the homeowners to receive the same insurance rating. The idea is to build the new station on property currently owned by Capital City Bank that is not in the 100-year flood zone.

Project #15

Work with the Florida Forest Service and develop and participate in the Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP) to reduce wildfire risks within the Wildland-Urban Interface. And inform the public of the Firewise building and landscape design principles and the Ready, Set, Go program.

This is an ongoing educational project- They have hosted several town hall meetings to educate the public.

Project #16

Protect and improve functioning of wetlands and waterways by eliminating and educating residents on living shorelines-

This is an ongoing project ANNER is constantly educating residents on living shorelines

Project #17

Update all County Mapping to include 911 overlay, flood prone areas, damage assessment, and property appraiser properties.

This is ongoing process and county agencies will assess the necessity of new maps as the situation arises.

Project #18

Mitigate storm drainage projects through out the county on road ways

Combined all roadway flooding caused by heavy rain and storm into one mitigation project objective- this is ongoing, and cost varies by the location and extent of flooding.

Project #19

Develop and deliver Disaster Resistant programs for the business and residential communities on "how to prepare" for future disasters.

This is ongoing project that FCEM prepares and educates residents on being prepared for any incident that may occur.

Project #20

Raise areas of CR 67 to prevent road flooding.

CR 67 is an evacuation route and preventing flooding will ensure life safety.

Project #21

Wind retrofit all critical facilities, government and school facilities-

Task Force merged all projects of wind retrofit for county facilities that are in need of wind hardening against hurricanes.

Project #22

Relocation of Apalachicola City Hall

Relocating City Hall out of a flood zone- City of Apalachicola is already relocated but could utilize funds for upgrading facility

Project #23

Upgrade or Replace City/ County Wastewater treatment facilities

Merged all Wastewater projects to ensure that all facilities are accounted for in the county.
