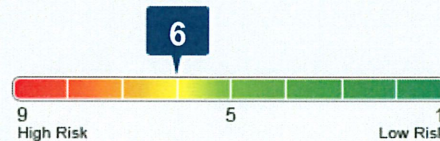

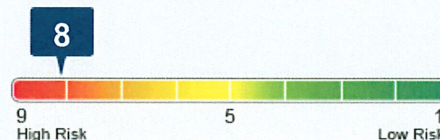

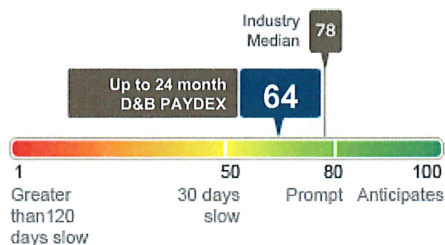


My name is Ronnie Moore. I was the Bastrop County (Texas) Engineer at the time of the Bastrop County Complex Wildfire in Sept. 2011. As the County Engineer, I was responsible for, and completed, the entire debris removal operation after the fire. Wayne (Wade) Kilpatrick was a contractor retained by Bastrop County to manage the removal of dead and damaged trees during the recovery operation after the fire.

The Bastrop County Complex Fire was the most destructive wildland urban interface wildfire in the history of Texas. The area impacted by the wildfire was approximately 34,000-acres of mature Loblolly Pines and several species of Oak trees. The areas that were burned were in the habitat of a Federally listed endangered species (Houston Toad). We performed tree removal from County and Texas DOT road rights of way; and over 2,000 privately owned parcels through FEMA's Private Property Debris Removal (PPDR) program. Mr. Kilpatrick helped in the removal of over 70,000 trees. Many of the trees were near power lines and along roadways that had moving vehicular traffic on the roadway during the tree removal operation.

Mr. Kilpatrick had a major role in the success of the County's tree removal operation. In fact, I do not think the County could have succeeded at the level we did without the guidance and assistance provided by Mr. Kilpatrick.

Mr. Kilpatrick helped Bastrop County by providing experienced leadership along with his wisdom and knowledge of the governmental cost reimbursement process, throughout what was a very challenging and demanding undertaking. I highly recommend Mr. Kilpatrick, based upon my personal experience of working daily with him for over a year of disaster recovery and tree removal operations.

His guys were tasked with clearing enormous amounts of flood debris from a location all the while being cognizant of the potential for body recovery. You could not have asked for a better equipment operator, Chad and his guys were given a very large and overwhelming task and they tackled it without hesitation. If it hadn't been for their crews we would not have found one of the victims in the debris. This flood was a tragic and horrible event, but, because of Chad and his team we were able to give a little closure to the family. We could not have done it without them. If you ever are in need of heavy equipment operators these guys are the ones to call!
