

EQUIPMENT

The type of equipment used will be based on the streets' width, accessibility, and overhead utilities. JBCCI will utilize the following standards:

Loading Equipment – All loading and moving equipment will be operated from the roadway, streets, alleys, or right-of-ways using clam shell loaders, booms, or grapple devices to collect and load debris into collection vehicles. No equipment will be operated behind the curb or outside the defined roadway shoulder/swale section or an area that may endanger operators or work crews, unless specifically directed to do so by Emergency officials.

Hauling Equipment – All trucks and trailers utilized to haul debris will be capable of rapidly dumping loads without assistance of other equipment. Trucks will be equipped with a tarp, or net to secure loose materials during transport to the disposal facility or site. The tarp/net will not exceed the truck body/trailer measurements. The trucks will also be equipped with a tailgate to assist in containing the debris.

Truck Measurements and Signage – JBCCI will use the following procedures to ensure that all trucks used are measured accurately and fully documented. This inspection will be performed by the County's Representative and JBCCI. Each inspection will be documented and signed by the appointed

inspection staff by Franklin County. The dimensions will be measured on the inside of the trailer. The truck specifications will be on file with the Inspection Staff. Signage and vehicle numbers will be prepared and ready prior to deployment. Trucks and heavy equipment will be equipped with adhesive signs that can be affixed to each side of the truck.

Response Times – Onsite emergency response and communications center is always active and on-site with Franklin County. It is pre-stocked, monthly comms checks conducted on satellite and radio communications.

For emergency response assistance team and debris clearance, crews will be available and working within 12 hours of notification.

For debris removal operations, upon the notice to proceed,

1. trucks will immediately start to go through the truck certification process with the County's representative with the goal of being completed in 48 hours and
2. site preparation for TDMS locations will immediately begin with the goal of being completed within 72 hours.

Hours of Operation – Debris removal operations that generate noise levels exceeding normal traffic flow will take place during daylight hours, 7 days a week. Adjustments to the hours of operation, based on working conditions and scope of work, may command a coordinated change with the approval of the designated official.


TDMS sites will be identified with National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements in mind. NEPA is a law of general applicability that mandated environmental assessments and impact studies be conducted to ensure that approved federal funded projects would not negatively impact the environment in violation of federal law. Enactment of NEPA led to enactment of other laws and regulations protecting the environment. Notable examples include the Clean Air and Water Acts, the National Historic Preservation Act and many others.

Site Characteristics

- 5+ acres
- Has some slope for drainage
- Not in wetlands or floodplain
- Evaluate Environmental Justice issues
- Consider the flow of traffic within the TDMS and segregation areas for hazardous waste, non-woody debris, debris reduction operations, towers, etc.
- Avoid neighborhood areas, healthcare facilities
These can be mitigated by TDMS occupying the middle of a larger tract of land.
- Land not likely contaminated by previous operations
- Obtain applicable local, state and federal permits

Documenting a TDMS site

Complete a Baseline Data Collection. Private and public land used as debris storage and reduction sites will be returned to its original condition following site closeout. Baseline data are essential to document the condition of the land before it is used as a debris storage and reduction site. As soon as a site is selected, JBCCI may be tasked with establishing the TDMS. Baseline data must be gathered. The TDMS manager will work closely with local, and State officials baseline data. 1. Videotape and Photograph the site.

Thoroughly videotape and/or photograph (ground or aerial) each site before any activities begin and periodically update video and photographic documentation to track site evolution.

2. Document Physical Features.

Notations about existing structures, fences, culverts, irrigation systems and landscaping can help evaluate possible damage claims made later. This documentation should occur in the JBCCI daily log and provided to the Planning Section or Quality Control.

3. Sample Soil and Water.

- ☐ Obtain random soil samples prior to volume reduction activities. Document activity in the JBCCI daily log
- ☐ Due to time constraints, sampling may actually occur after reduction operations commence.
- ☐ Household hazardous waste, ash and fuel storage areas will be sampled prior to site setup.

4. TDMS Manager

- ☐ Periodically sketch site operation layout and include in the daily log.
- ☐ Periodically map or sketch activity locations so that areas of concern can be pinpointed later for additional sampling.

5. TDMS Manager Document Quality Assurance Issues.

Document operations that will have a bearing on site closeout, such as petroleum spills at fueling sites, hydraulic fluid spills at equipment breakdowns, discovery of household hazardous waste in debris and details on any commercial, agricultural or industrial hazardous and toxic waste storage and disposal.

6. Plan Environmental Remediation.

Final restoration of the landscape must be acceptable to the landowner. We will come to an agreement with the landowner prior to occupancy to establish reasonable expectations of site conditions upon site closeout.

Tower Construction

Monitoring towers will be constructed to a client's specifications. If the client does not specify; the following standards will be used as a guide. The tower shall be constructed using pressure treated wood, the floor elevation of the tower shall be 10 foot above the existing ground elevation, the floor area shall be 8' by 8', constructed of 2"x 8" joists, 16" O.C. with ¾" plywood supported by four 6" x 6" posts, the perimeter of the floor area shall be protected by a 42 inch high wall constructed of 2" x 4" studs and ½" inch plywood, the floor area shall be covered with a corrugated tin roof or approved equivalent, the roof shall provide a minimum of 6'-6" of headroom below the support beams, and the access to the tower shall be wooden steps with a handrail. Industrial, all-terrain scissor lifts with personnel capacity of 3 or greater may be used in approved conditions.

Grinding and Chipping. Hurricanes, tornadoes and ice storms present the opportunity to employ large-scale grinding and chipping operations as part of the overall debris volume reduction strategy. Hurricanes can blow away scarce topsoil in the agricultural areas and cause extensive tree damage and blow-down. This two-fold loss, combined with local climatic conditions, may present an opportunity to reduce clean, woody debris into suitable mulch that can be used to replenish the topsoil and retain soil moisture.

PROPOSAL MATRIX

The economic feasibility of grinding and chipping woody debris must be studied carefully. The cost of chipping and grinding is basically equal to that of incineration; however, there are significant differences in volume reduction. Incineration, for example, reduces the volume approximately 95%, leaving only an ash residue for disposal. Chipping and grinding reduces the volume on a 4-to-1 ratio (4 cubic yards is reduced to 1 cubic yard) or by 75%. For chipping and grinding to be feasible, the 25% of volume remaining must have some benefit or use. The ability to use the recycled wood chips as mulch for agricultural purposes or as fuel for industrial heating or in a cogeneration plant helps to tip the economic scale toward chipping and grinding. Because of shallow topsoil conditions in some locations, mulch is a desirable product. In other locations, however, the mulch may become nothing more than a landfill product. The designated debris manager and staff should work closely with local environmental and agricultural groups to determine if there is a market for mulch.

Grinders are ideal for use at debris storage and reduction sites because of their high volume reduction capacity. However, there is a need for a large area to hold the resulting mulch. Ingress and egress to the site is also an important consideration. Finally, properly locating the grinders is critical for noise and safety considerations. The following specifications should provide a mulch product that is suitable for agricultural purposes:

- The average size of wood chips produced should not exceed 4 inches in length and ½ inch in diameter.
- Production output should average 100 to 150 cubic yards per hour when debris is moderately contaminated with plastic and dirt and feeding operations are slow and 200 to 250 cubic yards per hour for relatively clean debris. Note that this is not machine capability; this is contractor output or performance capability.
- Chips or mulch should be stored in piles no higher than 15 feet and located so as not to hinder hauling operations.
- Contaminants are all materials other than wood products and should be held to 10% or less for the mulch to be acceptable.
- Plastics should be eliminated completely. To help eliminate contaminants, root rake loaders should be used to feed or crowd materials to the chipper or grinder. Bucket-loaders tend to scoop up earth, causing excessive wear to the grinder or chipper. Hand laborers should remove contaminants prior to feeding the grinders. Shaker screens should be used when processing stumps with root balls or when large amounts of soil are present in the woody debris. The separated soil can also be recycled back to the agricultural community. Brush chippers are ideal for use in residential areas, orchards, or groves. The damaged and uprooted trees present significant problems if they are pushed to the right-of-way to wait for eventual pick-up and transport to storage and reduction sites.
- In addition, the use of on-site chippers allows the material to be used as mulch in the area where it is chipped, thereby saving the cost of transporting it.

Closure of TDMS site

Each TDMS Site will eventually be emptied of all material and restored to a near-as-possible previous condition and use by JBCCI. JBCCI will remove and dispose of all mixed debris, C&D debris, and debris residue to approved final disposal locations and/or landfills. The Debris Monitoring Consultant (if applicable) or appropriate Jurisdiction personnel will monitor all closeout activities to ensure we contract requirements.

Typical closure activities include:

- Contacting FDEP prior to commencing close-out operations.

- Removal of all debris and its residue from the site.
- May require environmental sampling in coordination with FDEP (ash, soil, and groundwater).
- Restoration of Site after addressing all environmental concerns and issues, if any.
- FDEP notification (in writing) that all closure activities have been completed.
- Final acceptance is issued.

Contractor Quality Control

- Documentation completed in on file in the Plans Section
- TDMS Manager ensure that all required local, state and federal permits are on file in the Plans Section
- TDMS Manager ensure that dust control measures are evaluated every 6 hours of operation.
- TDMS Manager ensure that signage necessary for flow of traffic is clearly posted and that traffic follows direction.
- Hazardous Waste Specialist review all temporary hazardous waste storage facilities for compliance with standards.

DEBRIS COLLECTION AND TRANSPORTATION

Removal Activities – From the Grid/Zone Assignments – Areas are based on priority and accessibility. The zones will be equitably established to ensure timely progression throughout the affected area. As crews work in their zone; they will adhere to a “clean as you go” for the waste stream being worked. The crews will work methodically through a zone from street to street. The crew size and resources will be adjusted or modified as needed during removal phase.

Debris Segregation – Initial storm/event debris will be separated when feasible.

- Crews will attempt to segregate materials, where feasible, into constituent piles for collection and disposal. Hazardous materials will be segregated and properly stored for future collection.
- Mixed debris will be collected as C&D.

Debris collection passes will continue up to the point where the remaining debris consists of light litter that can be easily collected using raking and sweeping methods of operation.

CLEAN AS YOU GO POLICY

JBCCI and its staff provide Clean as you go policy. During an event JBCCI and its staff ensure that all debris removal activities address Cleaning as you go as standard practice. Making sure areas are left in such condition for proper restoration. This is inclusive of all phases of debris removal work including load and haul, TDS site management, and final disposal.

FINAL DISPOSAL OF REDUCTIONS

Disposal of all eligible debris, reduced debris, ash residue and other products of the debris management will be in accordance with all applicable State, Federal and Local laws. Disposal is handled as direct pass-thru cost with no mark up to the County. JBCCI will ensure documentation of disposal in accordance with FEMA protocol utilizing an approved Collection/Disposal Ticket, tipping ticket and will coordinate activities with the County Debris Manager.

TREE TRIMMING, REMOVAL OF LEANERS, HANGERS AND STUMPS

JBCCI will ensure documentation of the location of all leaners, hangers and stumps for FEMA approval for removal. JBCCI will perform all removal of the leaners, hangers and stumps, and coordinate

during the debris removal/disposal operations. JBCCI will perform the backfilling of any holes subsequent to the stump removal.

REDUCED DEBRIS/FINAL HAUL OUT TO DISPOSAL FACILITY

The same procedure listed above will be implemented for debris taken to a TDMSS. However, during the final haul out, a separate ticket will be issued for the hauling to the final disposal site documenting haul out time, cubic yards, disposal location, time, and cubic yards.






