Summit Group Consulting, LLC is pleased to submit this response to the County's request for proposals to continue providing professional knowledgeable grant consulting and program management services for you. We have worked extensively with several federal and many state agencies, as well as all types of local governments and can communicate effectively with the County's counterparts during the grant development, reimbursement, and event closeout phases.

At the County's request, the Summit Team will assign or deploy a diverse group of seasoned technical professionals and subject matter experts who, together, successfully manage grant programs and are able to meet or exceed the County's needs for this contract. In addition to grant management, Summit brings experienced architectural, structural, and environmental engineers, environmental scientists, and related subject matter experts, all supported by a full-service team of specification writers, financial analysts, computer specialists, and cost estimators to the grant development team.

Summit Group's defining characteristics:

You already know us. We have been working with the County and its reimbursement grants for the past 5 years, working with the County and Emergency Management and your Hurricane Michael projects in the weeks immediately following landfall and including resolving issues with DEM to fund a five year old management cost reimbursement request. Although we were only able to work with the County under a task order for the first few weeks Of Hurricane Michael, we never left the County and continued to provide advice and assistance as needed through present day.

Summit teams only with highly trained grant professionals who have a minimum of 10 years actual field experience at the federal, state, and/or local level, specializing in their assigned tasks. Summit also teams with Daniel Arms, a former Federal Coordinating Officer and one of the original authors of the FEMA guide PAPPG, providing great insight on the intent of controversial sections of the guide and eligibility issues.

Summit's principal, Jeanne Devlin, received her degree from Texas A&M University with a double major in Economics and Political Science (Latin honors) with a strong background in

Summit is already actively engaged with clients regarding the August 3, 2022 retroactive Stafford Act Section 422 rules changes, and the DRRA 2018 interim policy rule changes, researching the congressional records intently, and working directly with FEMA to resolve issues.

All completed grants have obligated as written, regardless of the many obstacles we overcame with FEMA to ensure the Clients' maximum grant funding. No Summit grant has ever been the subject of an OIG investigation.

Summit operates and maintains a web based grant file system, Summit Direct, which enables the County to send all data and documents through a single secure web link, reducing the time necessary for documentation dissemination and paper file organization and transportation.

Summit strategically engages with clients based on jurisdictional boundaries to ensure we are not over extended in the event of a large storm. Personnel deployed to the County during an incident will work out of Summit's Carrabelle, FL office and will dedicate 100% of their working hours to Franklin County's response and recovery.

In Summary,

Jeanne Devlin – Jeanne has worked with federal and state grants of various types since 1988 and began specializing specifically in disaster recovery grants beginning 2008 with employment at U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security/FEMA as an Intergovernmental Affairs Specialist working directly with disaster affected States, Tribes, and Local Jurisdictions to resolve disputes and issues brought to FEMA-HQ directly or through Congressional Inquiry. Jeanne later left federal employment to work directly with States during the grant development phase of disaster recovery first in Texas, then following with Louisiana, New Jersey, Florida, and Kentucky with support to contractors with other State contracts. Jeanne previously worked as first a Florida DEM employee then subsequently as a Florida DEM state contractor and was State Task Force Lead for Hurricane Matthew in 2016 during the beginning phase of the "New PA Model" implementation. Also as a Florida DEM contractor, Jeanne taught the FL DOT disaster recovery class including the FEMA and the FHWA grant program "FDOT FEMA Training" 2016. Jeanne is a State instructor teaching recovery classes throughout Florida and at conference, including authoring and designing the new Advanced Recovery class with topics including recent FEMA policy changes through interim policies, administrative memos, etc. Jeanne now works directly with Local and Regional Governments through all phases of disaster recovery including pre-storm planning, grant development, mitigation identification and proposal development, reimbursement requests, information requests, first and second appeals including negotiation, project closeout, insurance reconciliation, damage assessments, etc. Jeanne also has three years of legal experience as Sr. Vice President of a law firm specifically working with Applicants to file appeals to FEMA project adverse determinations to date without a loss. Jeanne worked with the City of Elizabeth during their Hurricane Sandy grant development phase which included a DHS-OIG audit of a \$25 million Category G project with favorable findings.

Eric Zabukovek has lived and worked in Florida all of his life including four years as an employee with FL DEM and an additional 12 years as a State and Local contractor in Florida and other states. Eric's achievements within Florida include Project Manager for Bay County, FL – Hurricane Michael and Deputy Project Manager for Miami-Dade County, FL – Surfside Building Collapse. Eric also worked for Jeanne as a Team Lead during FL-Hurricane Matthew and also as a Technical

Specialist during Lafourche Parish, LA – Hurricane Ida. Eric's specialties include the FEMA and FHWA grant programs, cost estimating, grant development, site inspections, damage assessments, financial reconciliation, project closeout validation, and all phases of grant development from initial damage assessments to FEMA final closeout.

Both Jeanne and Eric worked at FL DEM at a time that the division was managing the infamous 2004-5 Florida seven major storms disaster recovery. Their work included project development, final payments, and grant closeouts which included first and second appeals and OIG audits and all policy and research and responses. Jeanne also assisted FL DEM with the State grant financial reconciliation and grant closeout (of entire disasters including individual applicant project closeouts).

Summit has all Hurricane Ian Category A-E work complete and estimated projects submitted to FEMA prior to the 60-day deadline to report damages, and all projects have obligated as written with no reductions. We are in the process of event closeout.

Summit is working with both the City of St Cloud and with the City of Holmes Beach concurrently with pre-disaster recovery planning saving both Cities funding as an economy of scale. Pre-disaster recovery planning also helps to ensure the Cities' FEMA projects will be submitted in a timely manner expediting full reimbursement funding for grant complete projects. The City of Holmes Beach is current with all NIMS pre-requisite training requirements to continue with the advanced requirements to complete NIMS compliance which is a condition of

FL F-ROC compliance. The City is also current with all pre-storm grant data tables as we entered the 2023 storm season. These completed data tables will be important when FEMA rolls out the next phase of Grants Portal which will house the electronic version of these data tables.

Summit is currently working with the City to develop their Category B — Emergency Protective Measures project for Hurricane Idalia. The coastal city took on 4'-6' of surge in residential areas while under mandatory evacuation and has extensive preparation and life safety costs to document and validate.

Summit personnel have provided the City with excellent grant management services since 2017 and will continue to do so. To date, projects written by us for the City have obligated as written and survived the five years of state and federal project obligation and disbursement issues to obligate as written in every case. Summit personnel also reconciled and requested, and received for the City full supplemental insurance funding to cover all gaps not funded by FEMA

reimbursement. In some cases, Summit was also successful in securing for the City additional insurance funds for disaster related sites not eligible for FEMA funding. Only the COVID projects are under appeal, as are many COVID projects across the Country. FL DEM has agreed with the City on all appellate points and recommended to FEMA the adverse determination be reversed. All other projects obligated have done so as written and without issues.

Summit, teamed with GPD Group, is working with the City to develop a Hazard Mitigation plan to alleviate catastrophic flooding such as the Spring 2010 flooding event that destroyed most of downtown Olive Hill, KY. Summit is also working directly with the City to write water line repair projects incorporating FEMA Recovery Interim Policy FP-104-009-11 requirements to build resiliency into certain permanent work repairs. The Disaster Recovery Reform Act of 2018 (DRRA) amended Stafford Act Sections 323 and 406, requiring FEMA to fund repair, restoration, reconstruction, or replacement in conformity with "the latest published editions of relevant consensus-based codes, specifications, and standards that incorporate the latest hazard-resistant design and establish minimum acceptable criteria for the design, construction, and maintenance of residential structures and facilities that may be eligible for assistance under this Act for the purposes of protecting the health, safety, and general welfare of a facility's users against disasters." As such, many repair projects that were previously considered a separate hazard mitigation proposal under Section 404 and 406 are now considered "in-kind" repairs providing additional funding for enhanced repairs and less grant management activity to apply for a separate HM grant. In the City's next event, the DRRA interim policy will not only provide single source funding for some project repairs and enhancements, but also negate much of the arguing about the difference between mitigation and damage dimensions. And the precedent will be set with these recent KY projects.

Summit is also working with the City regarding FEMA's August 3, 2022 rulemaking change to Section 422 – Simplified Procedures which increased the small project threshold to \$1 million and requiring all unobligated projects to comply retroactive to March 2020. While this may be a good idea up front, retroactively applying this rule change to estimated project previously not a small project means there are no cost adjustment versions. We will have these bugs worked out with precedent before the City has to deal with version and appeal issues that may arise as a result of the new Section 422 rule change.

Summit also partners with GPD Group to develop Section 404 HMGP projects for a Floodplain Planning Grant and a Floodplain mitigation grant.



5 PROPOSED TECHNICAL APPROACH



Proposed Technical Approach

- 1. Provide a description of the firm's general approach to the proposed scope of services to include team organization, staff assignments, schedules, quality assurance and accountability.
 - 1. Pre-event Recovery Planning (Preparedness): If requested, Summit works with the County in the 3rd and 4th quarters (Jan-June) to gather and validate Applicant level documentation such as insurance policies and documents, contract review, policy review, data tables completed with updated force account data such as employee lists and rosters and equipment lists matched to FEMA cost codes, pre-event coordination meetings with the debris haul and monitor contractors, identification and permitting of DMS sites, permit application and renewal for other types of projects including USACE (if there is a need), identification of projects for the LMS list, (Section 404 HM projects and other grants), coordination with the State if there is potential overlap, and other pre-storm activities. The work with pre-storm applicant level documents and data tables is an important component of the pending new Grants Portal version not yet live.

2. Short-term Recovery Phase:

- First day of the 5 day cone: create the call down list ascertaining availability of scheduled Summit personnel (scheduling described in Question 2. below) with 24 hour notice to deploy. Summit loads trucks with field equipment. If the Project Manager and Sr. Grant Specialists are not already in Florida, they start heading this way. Summit identifies pre-planned lodging sources for deployed personnel. If the County requests a Summit person to assist with mission requests to the State, Brian or Jeanne can assist in the EOC.
- Third day of the 5 day cone (assuming the County is still in the cone), at the
 County's request Brian or Jeanne can deploy to the County's EOC to begin
 documentation validation and project development (VAYGO) and to
 review contract procurement and other emergency related cost activities.
 If the County does not require Summit's presence at the EOC, the same
 activities in a limited scope will begin remotely at a secure location inland
 if either office is also compromised by the storm.
- 72 hours after landfall (or sooner depending on the magnitude of the storm damage), Brian and/or engineers will deploy to the County and begin initial and project damage assessments. Once the County is declared, Jeanne will submit the County's Request for Public Assistance (RPA) to the State through FLPA or Grants Portal. Project development and insurance adjusting begins.

3. Intermediate Recovery Phase: Depending on the severity of landfall, Jeanne and/or Brian will remain deployed to the County to complete comprehensive damage assessments and to assist with FEMA Joint PDAs and to assist FEMA with the Site Inspections. If site inspections are virtual again, we will complete the FEMA site inspection forms and submit them from location. Jeanne will facilitate the initial FEMA on-site meetings and the Scoping Meeting then quickly transition the weekly or bi-weekly meetings to a conference call. Project development and insurance adjusting with Bob Stinebaugh continues. Either Brian or Jeanne will work directly with the debris contractors to ensure all data and documentation is submitted correctly and timely with a regular report to the County. The Damage Descriptions written during the initial site inspections are entered into the FEMA site inspection reports and into the Damage Inventory excel to ensure consistency of damage information. The Scoping Meeting event marks the beginning of the 60 day deadline to report damages. Jeanne will import and submit the Damage Inventory in grants Portal when complete or just before the required 60 day deadline, as the situation requires.

Summit's goal is to write all work complete projects and estimate all contract work projects pending procurement or initial notice to proceed that are without an engineering or permitting issue and have them ready for submission to FEMA on the 60th day post RSM, the day the Damage Inventory is due. Depending on the level of damage, GPD Group will provide stamped engineering reports with cost estimates for project development. Once these projects are reconciled to insurance adjustment, we request project numbers and submit them to FEMA. While the FEMA-JFO hounds other applicants to get their project documentation submitted and threaten them with a determination memo for insufficient documentation stripping their project funding, we note the 45 day deadline requirement for FEMA to obligate our submitted projects in Grants Portal and track these dates. As an added note, another Client's Hurricane Ian FEMA-PDMG and Mitigation Specialist have both commented several times bragging on us at the JFO for great grant work and wish more applicants had us to help them.

Depending on the magnitude of the storm, some large projects may require considerable time and effort to estimate. Once Summit is 80% complete with project development, Brian and/or others will return to the Sarasota office or their home base and continue to work remotely. Summit's North Florida office is in Franklin County. Jeanne will remain accessible here to the County with little or no notice required to attend meetings, site visits, etc.

All projects will be submitted to FEMA closeout ready and/or documentation complete. Summit will not submit any project level documentation in Grants Portal or FLPA until the project is 100% validated ensuring cost accuracy and FEMA compliance and the final agreed Site Inspection report uploaded by FEMA in portal. Once Brian and the team have completed the grant package for each

project, we will submit the EEI responses, streamlined projects, or expedited grant packages with documents in Grants Portal then advance to the FEMA-PDMG review. Summit will also request the development guide questions be sent to us for response which will give Summit the rights to submit the County's projects directly to the CRC for validation, bypassing the JFO review and wait period. JFO's in Region 4 have approved this request in the past and have saved the Clients valuable time in the reimbursement process.

Project complete submission also ensures no project moves forward missing scope elements or costs. Now that Stafford Act Section 422 - Simplified Procedures rules have changed to increase the small project threshold to \$1 million, no versions will be allowed to projects under \$1 million and small project netting is now the only possibility for cost adjustment. 100% validation and documentation complete projects will help the County avoid the inherent pitfalls of \$1 million small projects. Once projects obligate, the small projects (under \$250,000.00) should be paid by DEM without audit and the County should receive payment in 30 days. We do not yet know if the State Administrative Agency (SAA, or FL equivalent) will require audit on these "super-smalls" given the state's contribution as state share funding. Large projects over \$1 million will fall into the OLA review queue and large projects over \$2.5 million (sliding scale depending on the storm and other factors) may fall into the FEMA-OIG oversight queue along with the Section 428 alternative procedures projects. Jeanne will work directly with DEM and FEMA including DHS-OIG if necessary to manage information requests, strategic funds management, etc. In the past, Jeanne has worked directly with FEMA-OIG during integrity monitoring of multi-million dollar projects producing a positive findings report for the Subrecipient.

Jeanne will work directly with the State submitting all large projects (\$1 million or more unless SAA says otherwise) in FLPA for advance or reimbursement. Given that all projects are written closeout complete, estimated large projects and those subject to FEMA-Strategic Funds Management should be the only heavy lift for both reimbursement and project closeout. (Assumptions made in this paragraph relate to the Congressional Record and Federal Register Notice accompanying the recent rule change to Stafford Act Section 422 — Simplified Procedures rule change.)

4. Long Term Recovery Phase: Jeanne will continue to work with the County and related oversight agencies on any remaining "super-large" and pilot projects until grant completion and final funding reconciliation and disbursement. Jeanne or other Summit personnel will create and submit time extension requests (if necessary) and quarterly reports to DEM through FLPA and create a quarterly status report for the County as we do now. If requested, Jeanne will also work with the County on any prospective Hazard Mitigation projects or LMS activities. If environmental assessments or permitting are necessary, Summit teams with

ECOgenesis, LLC, to provide environmental and cultural resource project services including permitting and NEPA and FEMA-EHP review services.

Summit Group is a state certified WBE business and will be assigned 100% of all grant administration and financial work. 100% of all environmental science and permitting work necessary for grant development will be assigned to ECOgenesis, a certified SBA and state certified WBE Sarasota business. When discussing potential teaming opportunities with other contractors, Summit requests M/WBE status and certificates. Summit also currently teams with other M/WBE companies to provide consulting services.

Brian will work with the County to validate and submit all large project reimbursement requests and project closeouts, if any. This workload is anticipated to be much less than in the past with the new \$1 million small project threshold. However, it remains to be seen if the State Administrative Agency (or equivalent) requires projects of lesser amounts to be validated and closed formally as in the past. We will work with the State on management cost eligibility if this is the case. With the County's request, Gina Vought, our CDBG and Section 404 and 406 HM Specialist will work with the County to identify and manage the County's CDBG-DR projects and to work with the team to support hazard mitigation proposals and projects. If requested, Eric Zabukovek will work with the County regarding Federal Hwy Administration (FHWA) projects and questions. (See Gina's and Eric's resume for previous experience.)

Once all PA projects are closed and funded, Jeanne will manage the final management cost project and account (event) closeout. Jeanne will continue to work with the County concerning mitigation opportunities and projects, training, recovery planning, and any other needs the County may have. While we hope the County will have no appeal issues, Jeanne and Daniel Arms will consult with the State and other FEMA contacts to research and write the appeals. Summit's current win rate is 100% for those first appeals to which FEMA has responded.

Summit's org chart is both scalable and flexible, as an ICS event should be. The magnitude of the storm will determine deployment of the number of personnel listed on the attached organization chart. For smaller events such as category 1 and 2 hurricanes, Jeanne, Brian, and possibly Eric or an engineer will be assigned to the County's project. For larger or complex events, and depending on specific needs, others listed on the organization chart will be deployed as needed for tasks as assigned to them on the chart.

Summit's organizational structure is very flattened. We work with each other, not for one another. As such, any person incurring billable costs to the County's project will provide a line item product/service to the project, regardless of title or org chart position. Summit does not expect the County to carry overhead hours

not directly related to grant management nor do we hire or contract such non-productive positions.

Summit will provide to the County as requested a grant status report. Summit will also prepare for the County any reports or informational documents the County may request for meetings and communications. Summit, likely Jeanne, will also facilitate or attend such meetings at the County's request.

If for some unknown reason, Jeanne or Brian is not able to continue grant services, Eric Zabukovek will take their place until such time as they can return to work.

Summit has an excellent working relationship with DEM and FEMA leadership and will leverage those relationships to assist the County through the grant process.

Summit operates and maintains a 100% web based grant file system, Summit Direct, which enables the County to send all data and documents through a single secure web link, reducing the time necessary for documentation dissemination and paper file organization and transportation. The project specialist can also send an email request including a drag and drop web link to the County for a specific document. Summit will also assign read only access to the County Contract Manager or other designated person for live visibility on the grant process files and status. Summit Direct has no required software to purchase or download.

Summit's goal is to, as much as allowable, to pursue immediate needs funding and insurance proceeds to keep the County in front of major expenditures in a large event. Leveraging expedited and streamlined projects decreases the time waiting for funds disbursement while working directly with the insurance adjuster to provide initial payout with completed grant packages for supplemental funding prior to construction notice to proceed and payment applicant review of construction work completed.

Summit's technical approach is very aggressive and has worked very well for the past six years. Testing this approach compared to that of other contractors with which we have worked in the past proves a much higher rate of return to the Client than previously seen as a subcontractor to other prime contractors. We are currently working with several of our clients to close the Hurricane Ian and Nicole events.

2. Describe the firm's response and service if multiple cities and counties were in need.

Summit strategically engages with clients based on jurisdictional boundaries to ensure we are not over-extended in the event of a large storm. Personnel assigned or deployed to the County during an incident will dedicate 100% of their working hours to the County's response and recovery.

Also, Summit has a call down of over 600 qualified reservists. We schedule prepositioned reservists based on storm projections, current workload, and needs of our strategic partners. Summit has already analyzed our potential 3rd and 4th quarter (January-June 2024) needs and the potential needs of our engineering prime contractors and reserved certain personnel for potential deployment should the need arise. The attached organization chart shows the 3rd and 4th quarter reserve list for North and Central Florida. Because Summit does not overextend in a particular geographic area, the County is assured of adequate qualified and experienced grant management personnel pre-positioned to serve the County with a 24-hour notice to proceed.

3. Provide relevant availability guidelines and/or the average time between requests for meetings and actual attendance for current clients. Discuss the availability of the primary contact relative to current and future client workload. Include for each individual the estimated number of hours that will be contributed to this agreement and in what capacity they would serve to this agreement.

Summit respectfully requests at least a 24 hour notice for on-site meetings and formal conference calls. Both Jeanne and Eric live in Florida and barring unforeseen circumstances could be available for on-site meetings in in the County within 24 hours. However, Jeanne lives in Franklin County and can be available to the County with little notice if necessary. Remote work requests are tasked within the hour of receipt by the Project Manager or designated POC.

All Summit personnel assigned to a specific project are contracted for full time availability for work. If the County requires each person to work full time hours, we are available to do so. Jeanne will work with the County to establish work schedules to complement the County's needs. Summit will request the County's approval to assign a worker more than 40 hours of work per week. Summit does not deploy the same person to multiple gray sky tasks so work by those deployed to the County will be exclusively for the County's project. Also, as the project starts to right-size, Summit personnel are expected to right-size their work schedules as well. In short, Summit personnel assigned to the County's project will remain working on the project as long as they are needed and will adjust hours or demobilize as the project right-sizes.

Jeanne will be the Project Manager for the County's contract, operating locally within the County, and can be available for meetings and other required assessments and site visits with little notice.

4. Describe the amount of time and ability that your firm would be able to devote to the County to research the current process of how our organization is seeking federal reimbursement and

how that process could be streamlined, as well as how we can better prepare before a loss to document a claim.

Summit will engage with the County to continue Pre-event Recovery Planning. Included in the planning is updated data tables with Applicant level information necessary for force account cost reimbursement such as the equipment list, contract review for procurement compliance and scope accuracy, pre-storm documentation training, LMS mitigation project lists, insurance review, archive of applicant level documents, identification of debris management and final disposal sites along with permit renewal, pre-event meetings with the debris haul and monitor contractors, and other pre-event activities that can be completed prior to an event. Summit will continue to work with the County throughout each year to streamline grant processes, provide training for the County accordingly especially when work reports are necessary to validate force account work and costs, and maximize/optimize grant funding as preparedness is a continual process. The work with pre-storm applicant level documents and data tables is an important component of the pending new Grants Portal version not yet live.

5. Describe how the firm will provide a website and/or portal with details on status of projects.

Summit operates and maintains a 100% web based grant file system, Summit Direct, which enables the County to send all data and documents through a single secure web link portal, reducing the time necessary for documentation dissemination and paper file organization and transportation. The project specialist can also send an email request including a drag and drop web link to the County for a specific document. Summit will also assign read only access to the County Contract Manager or other designated person for live visibility of all grant process files and status. Summit Direct has no required software to purchase or download.

Jeanne will create a single file in the Summit Direct secure site to add Grant Status Reports and deliverables for the County's review and download.

6. Describe how your firm would include public adjusting, including coordinating with the Count[y], insurance and/or grant reimbursement as deemed necessary.

Summit Group works with Bob Stinebaugh, a certified Public Adjuster, to create insurance claim reports to reconcile grant project costs to the initial and supplemental statements of loss. Reconciling completed grant packages to the insurance supplemental state of loss often results in complete project funding and in some cases also provides insurance funding for damages not otherwise eligible for FEMA funding.

FEMA prevailed in its assertion that a federally funded project did not cause the dewatering and therefore, the APE would be just the area of ground disturbing activities in direct relationship to the construction activities necessary to repair the dam to pre-disaster condition, with the exception of minor increase of the footprint required to upgrade the dam to current codes and standards, and that the re-watering of the impoundment area would actually preserve in-place any artifacts present.

- "Albany Oakview-Riverside Cemetery": (Estimated \$1,000,000 project). Political, highly controversial, multi-cultural, and emotionally sensitive project. Storm caused Christian, Jewish, and Afro-American graves to float up out of the ground and beyond, causing scattered human remains to intermingle. The highly sensitive environment triggered lock-down by the National Guard until mass refrigeration of bones could all be x-rayed to establish cultural identities necessary to ensure proper reinterment in the original sections of the cemetery, however, black communities sought to have their ancestors who were buried in risk-prone lower terrain areas, reburied in higher terrain, lower risk areas of the cemetery along with typical higher income community graves. Also, SHPO contended FEMA responsible for full Cultural Resource Survey (CRS) of entire cemetery to establish boundaries of eligible resources, to then determine if eligible resources were located within undertaking's "Area of Potential Effect" (APE) of the federally funded undertaking. FEMA prevailed in assertion that the storm impacted any historical resources present, not FEMA, and FEMA only responsible to repair storm damaged resources to Secretary of Interior Standards (SOI), a cost of over \$1,000,000, but still saving taxpayers an additional estimated \$500,000 in assessment costs and considerable associated recordation costs, causing considerable delays in remedying delicate situation.
- "Macon County Water Plant": Flooded Water Plant eligible for a federally funded replacement facility. Applicant chose an "Improved Project" and the "Relocation" of the facility with an estimated cost of \$80,000,000. The existing facility consisted of National Register (NR) eligible buildings, 7 industrial resources, and 2 known archaeological sites previously requiring a Phase II Archeological Surveys. Initial Cultural Resource Assessment (CRA) determined the existence of 2 additional archaeological sites and project design impacts to cultural resources were determined unavoidable, requiring consultation with SHPO, the tribes, and other stakeholders to formulate a mitigation/treatment plan to mitigate the loss incurred from the "Adverse Effect" to a Register eligible resource as a result of extensive excavation, resulting in the necessary curating of artifacts, to be set forth in a binding "Memorandum of Agreement" signed by appropriate consulting parties.
- "Albany, GA HMGP 404 Buyout" (Acquisition) of Properties: Responsible for HP Section 106 Compliance Review, SHPO/THPO/stakeholder consultations, and oversight of the multitude of varied private residential and commercial buy-out properties. The restoration plan involved a cascading hydrologic design that included rehabilitation of a highly eroded surface water conveyance that provides one of the only remaining connections between the dredged Red Chute Bayou and its historic floodplain. This complex hydrologic design will result in theestablishment of wetland hydroperiod durations and stages conducive to the forested wetland communities restored, and effective hydrologic reconnection to Red Chute Bayou

allowing for attenuation and storage of flood events; yet also abate highly damaging erosion during flooding of the site via this surface water conveyance to Red Chute Bayou.

Gulf Coastal Plains Mitigation Bank (Project Manager) — Ms. Fetterman initially provided senior technical and permitting oversight services of the Ecosystem Renewal subcontracted consultant for this + 1,900-acre herbaceous freshwater, intermediate brackish and saltwater mitigation bank. Ms. Fetterman became project manager after her previous firm assumed the project. Ms. Fetterman completed the permitting of the project and coordinated closely with federal and state agencies and the surrounding NWR to redesign a phased restoration plan for this prior-converted rice farm enclosed by levees. The banking project also incorporates the re-establishment of tidal channels and pools reconnecting the bank to the major Bayous forming the eastern and western property boundaries. The tidal network will also facilitate the restoration of high and low brackish and intermediate marsh to the southern section of the bank historically within salt marsh hydric soils. The bank will re-establish historic coastal prairie and freshwater marsh wetlands and drainage features in the northern portion that existed prior to agricultural conversion. The bank will provide essential fish and invertebrate nursery habitat. Ms. Fetterman's competency with this project in addressing agency concerns and in facilitating consensusbuilding between members of a large, multi-faceted federal and state inter-agency review team resulted in her previous firm assuming all project management and restoration design responsibilities.

Bayou Chevreuil Mitigation Bank (Project Manger) — Ms. Fetterman provided complete project management for this roughly 3,700-acre cypress-tupelo mitigation bank. Services rendered by Ms. Fetterman include prospectus development and federal/state agency permitting support, functional assessment analysis, construction oversight, monitoring and long-term site management. This project is hydrologically complex and required extensive historic aerial analysis and mapping of canopy openings to document tree mortality over time and system failure because of over-inundation, subsidence and impoundment from spoil disposal and levees. Ms. Fetterman was instrumental in formulating an innovative hydrologic and vegetative restoration plan, as well as an accompanying monitoring plan requiring sediment accretion analysis, micro-site monitoring for natural recruitment, and more extensive vegetative and hydrologic monitoring to determine system response to proposed mitigation treatments beyond those typically required for mitigation monitoring requirements. Ms. Fetterman was fortunate to work with Dr. John Day, Professor Emeritus of LSU and Dr. William Conner of the Baruch Wetland Institute as part of this project.

Turtle Bayou Mitigation Bank (Project Manager) —Ms. Fetterman provided project management and permitting oversight for establishing a 277-acre, multi-phase bottomland hardwood and cypress-tupelo mitigation bank near Alexandria, Louisiana. This site in 1952 was bottomland hardwood floodplain forest within the alluvial plain of the Red River. This now prior-converted rice farm will be re-established as floodplain forested wetland over a series of successive phases. The hydrologic design will result in re-establishment and restoration of two perennial streams and sloughs that previously drained through the site before the site was converted. The project will provide valuable, additional stepping-stone habitat along Bayou Beouf for the movement of the endangered Louisiana Black Bear between areas of designated critical habitat within the proposed service area of the bank to the east, west, north and south. Ms. Fetterman to date has provided feasibility and preliminary credit analysis, site data collection, and oversight of permitting products services. A draft MBI is currently under USACE and IRT agency review and comment.

Acadian-Haynesville Pipeline Offsite Mitigation Project (Project Manager) —Ms. Fetterman provided project management, WVA functional assessment analysis and senior technical oversight services for the permitting of this 170-acre permittee-responsible offsite bottomland hardwood mitigation project compensating for bottomland hardwood and cypress-tupelo wetland losses associated with the construction of an interstate pipeline. This 277-acre site, also located in Rapides Parish and directly adjacent to the Central Louisiana Mitigation Bank Project, was an extremely time-sensitive project requiring a 2-week turnaround. Ms. Fetterman effectively coordinated senior ecological and engineering staff from her previous firm to produce a complete mitigation work plan to the client to enable them to submit their permit application prior to changes in New Orleans District functional assessment policy and complete timely public noticing of the project.

Mid-Coast Aggregates Withlacoochee State Forest T.G. Lee Tract Offsite Mitigation Area (Senior Scientist) —Ms. Fetterman provided permitting and project oversight for restoration and mitigation design of a 25-acre offsite mitigation area located on state forest managed lands. By working closely with the state forestry management and technical staff, she facilitated a win-win restoration project that will result in the hydrologic and vegetative re-establishment and enhancement of historic freshwater marsh and wet prairie wetlands. The restoration will return to the site the historic mesic flatwoods and wetland complex that existed prior to ditching and draining of the site and conversion to improved pasture in the 1960s and 70s. Ms. Fetterman successfully completed the DEP and USACE permitting process on behalf of the client.

Senior Environmental Scientist, Southwest Florida Water Management District — While at the District from 2000-2007, Ms. Fetterman permitted over 1000 ERPs and WUPs.
